## Nicholas Leeper, M.D., President

Assistant Professor of Surgery (Vascular Surgery)  
and Medicine (Cardiovascular Medicine)  
at the Stanford University Medical Center

Dr. Leeper serves as the Board President for the Silicon Valley branch of the American Heart Association. He is an Assistant Professor of Cardiovascular Medicine and Vascular Surgery at Stanford University. He holds degrees with honors in Chemistry and Medicine from the University of Chicago, and completed his Internal Medicine training at the University of California, San Francisco. Dr. Leeper joined the Clinical Investigator Pathway at Stanford University in 2005, and served as the Division's Chief Cardiovascular Fellow in 2007. He is board certified in Cardiology and Vascular Medicine and cares for patients with aneurysms and peripheral vascular disease. Additionally, he is actively involved in early phase clinical trials for patients with cardiovascular disease. Academically, his laboratory studies translational vascular biology and human genetics, with a focus on pathological conditions such as atherosclerosis, vessel inflammation, endothelial cell dysfunction, and aneurysm formation.

Dr. Leeper's early faculty career was supported by research grants from the American Heart Association, and he has committed himself to raising funds which will support the next generation of physician scientists working to prevent heart attack and stroke.

## Sean Maloney, Chairman

Sean Maloney had a storied career at semiconductor giant Intel Corporation, working in key leadership roles from 1982 until his retirement in 2013. He was credited with numerous achievements, including the successful growth of Intel into Chinese and Asian markets.

Despite robust good health and habits, in 2010 he suffered a debilitating stroke wiping out his ability to write, to speak (aphasia), and to move his right side. He doggedly made a near full recovery, refusing to let the stroke sideline his career or family.

In 2014, Maloney was appointed Chairman of the Silicon Valley American Heart Association Board of Directors. He works tirelessly to raise funding and awareness for heart disease research. He hopes his story can touch the lives of survivors, their families and people across the globe.

Dr. Calvin Kuo MD, PhD is the Maureen Lyles D'Ambrogio Professor of Medicine (Hematology) at Stanford University. He is also Vice Chair of the Department of Medicine at Stanford Medical School and Co-lead of the Cancer Biology Program at the Stanford Cancer Center. His research interests include molecular regulation of angiogenesis and the blood-brain barrier with relevance to stroke, cancer and diabetes. He is a member of the American Society for Clinical Investigation and has received awards including an NIH Transformative R01 and the American Heart Association Innovative Science Award.

Dr. Kuo received his A.B. from Harvard College, the M.D. and Ph.D. degrees from Stanford University. He completed his residency in Internal Medicine at Brigham and Women's Hospital and Oncology Fellowship at the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute.

Joseph Woo, M.D. serves as the Norman E. Shumway Professor and Chair of the Department of Cardiothoracic Surgery at the Stanford University School of Medicine. He received his undergraduate degree from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and his M.D. from the University of Pennsylvania where he also conducted his postgraduate surgical training. At Penn, Dr. Woo also completed a postdoctoral research fellowship in novel molecular strategies for attenuating myocardial ischemic injury for which he won the American Heart Association Vivien Thomas Young Investigator Award. Dr. Woo joined the Penn faculty in 2002 as the Director of the Minimally Invasive Cardiac Surgery Program. He is a technically-gifted surgeon who has significantly advanced the field of complex valve repair and has developed several innovative new mitral and aortic valve repair operations. He also

led the Mechanical Circulatory Assist and Cardiac Transplant Program and has likewise developed and published novel LVAD and transplant techniques.

Nationally, Dr. Woo has chaired several committees, including the American Heart Association Cardiovascular Surgery and Anesthesia Council. He is an Associate Editor for the *Journal of Thoracic and Cardiovascular Surgery* and has served as a Guest Editor for *Circulation*.

In 2014, Dr. Woo moved to Stanford University to lead the Department of Cardiothoracic Surgery. Cardiovascular surgical clinical volume, research funding, and residency education programs have grown significantly.
