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Social Determinants of Health

- Several social determinants of health have been associated with an increased risk for stroke including a low education level, low income, living in an impoverished area, few available healthcare services, rural areas, social isolation, and lacking health insurance.
- These social determinants feed into well documented risk factors of stroke including hypertension, diabetes, hyperlipidemia, cigarette smoking, lack of physical exercise, and heart disease.



Social Determinants of Health

- As such, assessing for and assisting patients in addressing gaps in basic needs at home is of upmost importance in secondary stroke prevention.
- Strokes are 50% more likely in those with 3 or more SDOH risk factors in adults over 75 compared with those without any SDOH, controlling for other risk factors.
- In adults over 65, social isolation alone is associated with 4-fold greater risk of TIA or stroke.






