

The Eastern Kentucky STEM Goes Red Carol Barr Fund Student Scholarship Awards

Thank you for your interest in applying for the 2021-2022 Eastern Kentucky STEM Goes Red Scholarship. The American Heart Association's Go Red for Women movement developed this scholarship program in honor of Carol Barr, with the goal of bridging the gap between Eastern Kentucky student's interests in pursuing a career in a STEM field (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) and achieving their goals. The Eastern Kentucky STEM Goes Red Scholarship will award:

- Three (3) scholarships (made possible by The Murry Foundation) of \$10,000 each to qualifying applicants. Each of these scholarships is renewable under specified conditions for up to 3 additional years.
- Three (3) scholarships (made possible by Battelle Memorial Institute) of \$2,500 each to qualifying applicants. These awards are non-renewable.

Qualification Requirements:

- 9th-12th grade student currently attending a school in one of the 54 Eastern Kentucky counties served by SOAR (Shaping our Appalachian Region)
- Minimum 3.0 GPA
- Female
- U.S. citizen/permanent resident of the U.S.
- Applying for funding for the following:
 - Attendance at a college or university with the intent to major in a STEM-related field
 - Attendance at a vocational or technical trade institution with a focus on earning a degree/certificate in a STEM-related field
- Past award recipients are not eligible to re-apply.

In addition to meeting the scholarship qualifications, a review committee will select finalists based on:

- Academic achievement
- Interest and commitment to pursue a career in a STEM field
- At least one letter of recommendation from an educator. Qualities should include maturity, motivation, self-confidence, leadership, interest & commitment to STEM, and potential for success.
- Five (5) paragraph essay (500 words maximum, typed, double-spaced, one-sided) which addresses two of the application questions.

Application submissions for the 2021-2022 Eastern Kentucky STEM Goes Red Scholarship will be accepted via email to EKYSTEMscholarship@Heart.org between the dates of November 29, 2021 – April 15, 2022.

The six (6) awarded scholarship recipients (“Recipients”) will be notified in April of 2022. All notifications are final. The Recipients and their parent/guardian (“Parent”) will each be required to sign a Scholarship Letter Agreement with the AHA. Upon receipt of the signed Scholarship Letter Agreement, the AHA will authorize Gift of College to electronically send an e-gift card in the amount of the scholarship award that can be redeemed thru the Gift of College website into a 529 plan of the Recipients’/Parents’ choice. The e-gift card will be sent to the Parents’ email. Gift of College’s website provides information about 529 plan options if a Recipient does not currently have a 529 plan account. This scholarship award is not an indication of any special or preferential status for Recipients regarding their potential participation in any other AHA offered or sponsored programs, or any future employment with the AHA. The gift card must be redeemed within 1 year of date of issuance or funds are forfeited and will be returned by Gift of College to the AHA.
