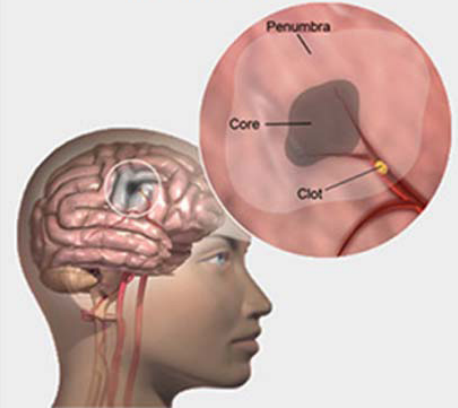

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Goal of Emergency Stroke Care: Save the Penumbra



Penumbra is zone of reversible ischemia around core of irreversible infarction - salvagable in first few hours after ischemic stroke onset.
