

## **Tricuspid Regurgitation**

Tricuspid regurgitation—often referred to as a leaky tricuspid valve—is a form of heart valve disease. It happens when the valve fails to close completely. When the valve leaks, the heart cannot pump blood as well.

### Signs and Symptoms

Symptoms may worsen as the valve begins to leak more













**Fatigue** 

of breath

Weakness

Rapid fluttering heartbeat

Swelling in ankles or abdomen

Pulsing in the blood vessels in the neck

### **Treatment options**

Will depend on the cause, how much the valve is leaking, your symptoms, and your preferences.

#### **Medication**

Your doctor may prescribe medication, such as diuretics, which removes extra fluid from the body.

# Minimally invasive procedures to fix the valve

Repair or replace the valve in a procedure in which the valve is delivered to the heart through a thin tube called a catheter that is inserted into a vein the leg or groin.

#### Surgical repair

In some cases, open heart surgery may be necessary.

#### Get regular checkups

Your health care team can monitor your valve by taking images of your heart, called an echocardiogram or "echo."
