

Florida

- 100% of school districts are successfully serving healthy meals that meet strong nutrition standardsⁱ
- 36.6% of 10-17 year olds are overweight or obeseⁱⁱ
- 89% of school districts need at least one piece of equipment to better serve nutritious foodsⁱⁱⁱ
- 60% of districts need kitchen infrastructure changes in at least one school^{iv}
- 1,715,901 students participated in school lunch program in 2017^v
- 855,037 students participated in school breakfast program in 2017vi
- In 2017 for 9th through 12th grades, 16.9% did not eat breakfast^{vii}
- In 2017 for 9th through 12th grades, 10% did not eat vegetables viii
- For school year 2016-2017, 65.1% of eligible school districts and 38.7% of eligible schools adopted the Community Eligibility Program^{ix}
