# ACADEMY OF CERTIFIED BRAIN INJURY SPECIALISTS (ACBIS): HISTORY

- ACBIS was established after a 1990 study of sub-acute and post acute brain injury programs were surveyed.
- 75% indicated that specialized training is needed for licensed staff
- 84% indicated that specialized training is needed for unlicensed staff

- 90% agreed the training curriculum include:
  - Cognitive, psychological, and social consequences of brain injury
  - Managing challenging behaviors and promoting positive skills
  - Techniques for working with families
  - 1996 ACBIS was established

### CBIS – Certified Brain Injury Specialist

- Assist to restore, maintain, and promote optimal health
- HS diploma
- 500 hours of direct, paid experience with individuals with brain injury.
- 70 question exam
- Demonstrates commitment to learning
- Remain marketable in your profession

### CBIST – Certified Brain Injury Specialist Trainer

- Minimum of 4-year bachelors degree
- Minimum of 5 years experience in field of brain injury
- Demonstration of advanced skills in brain injury (published articles, developing protocols, conducting trainings, etc.)
- Assist other in getting certified
- Get paid to help the brain injury community


### Provisional Certified Brain Injury Specialist

- Enrolled in accredited University (pre-med, psych, neuroscience, special education...)
- Complete 500 clinical hours or supervised internship
- Transition to CBIS within a 3-year period

#### Brain Injury Fundamentals Program

- Training and certificate program for non-licensed direct care staff, family, facility staff, first responders, etc.
  - Med management
  - Best practice for interaction
  - Behavior and brain injury
- Required course training and exam

#### Who Can Become a Certified Brain Injury Specialist (CBIS)?

- · OTs, PTs, SLPs
- · Neuropsychologists
- · Behavior analysts
- Nurses
- · Case managers
- · Music and recreation therapists
- · Special education teachers
- · Social workers
- · Rehabilitation counselors
- · Vocational specialists
- Other professionals in the field of brain injury

#### Eligibility Requirements

- 500 hours of currently verifiable direct contact experience with an individual or individuals with brain injury
  - Experience can be paid employment and/or academic internship
  - The qualifying experience must have included formal supervision or have been conducted while the applicant operated under a professional license
  - Volunteer work does not qualify
- Applicants must have a high school diploma or equivalent
- If operating under a professional license, must be in good standing



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### BRAIN INJURY ALLIANCE OF MONTANA:

- In-person CBIS training in the fall in Butte, MT
- Training includes:
  - Study materials, focus on content on the exam, practice exams, 1:1 sessions with CBIST,
